

# Description of iLSD: the Italian Legislative Speeches DataSet (up to 2016)

*A project by Luigi Curini, Paolo Martelli and Andrea Ceron*

**Units:** Parliamentary parties and cabinets

**Number of parties:** 63 (plus each cabinet). We considered only parties with at least 4 MPs in the Chamber of Deputies (*Camera dei Deputati*), with the exception of Liga Veneta during the Ninth Legislature, Lega Lombarda/Lega Nord during the Tenth Legislature, NPSI (New Italian Socialist Party) during the Fourteenth Legislature

**Number of cabinet considered:** 74 (including six non-investiture speeches: the speeches by Prodi during the Thirteenth and the Fifteenth Legislature in which, in both cases, the incumbent cabinet led by Prodi failed a vote of confidence; two speeches by Berlusconi in September and December 2010 and those by Letta I and II in October and December 2013 that did not fail the confidence vote)

**Time period covered:** all investiture debates between 1946 and 2016 held at the Chamber of Deputies with the exception of the first and fifth Andreotti governments, the Letta I non-investiture speech and the Renzi I investiture speech, when we analyze speeches from the Senate. During the 17<sup>th</sup> Legislature we report the number of seats in the House and in the Senate.

**Number of cases:** 752; including 74 cabinet speeches and 22 estimated legislative speech data (Speechtype = 2). In four cases we observe government formation as a result of a cabinet reshuffle in party composition, without a formal resignation (and therefore without a new investiture or confidence debate). In these cases the 36 party legislative speech data refers to the one of the previous government (Speechtype = 3).

**Number of variables:** 2 identification variables, 6 electoral data variables, 68 programmatic data variables, 8 policy dimensions.

**Data sources:** Publicly available election and parliamentary statistics and content analyzed legislative speeches (<http://legislature.camera.it/>).

## Variables in the dataset

**Legislature:** Legislature to which the investiture debates refer to

**Years\_Legislature:** years of the Legislature

**Edate:** Month and year of the formal nomination of a cabinet or of a cabinet reshuffle in party composition. Source up to 1996: Woldendorp, J., Keman, H. & Budge, I. (2000). *Party Government in 48 Democracies*. London: Kluwer Academic Publishers

**republic:** First or Second Republic

**investiture\_speech:** cabinet-ID excluding non-investiture speeches and cabinet reshuffle

**government\_id:** cabinet-ID including cabinet reshuffle

**government\_all:** cabinet-ID including non-investiture speeches and cabinet reshuffle

**Pervote:** Percentage of votes gained by each party.

**Voteest:** Election statistics often assign votes to electoral coalitions as a whole and do not distinguish between component members. Votes for parties in electoral coalitions and splinter groups have been estimated on the basis of the distribution of seats between them (0 = original figure from data source; 1 = estimated).

**Seats:** Absolute number of seats held by each party. We assigned the votes of excluded parties (see above) by proximity to a major party. Source up to 1994: Curini, L. & Martelli, P. (2009). *I partiti della Prima Repubblica. Governi e maggioranze dalla Costituente a Tangentopoli*. Roma: Carocci).

**Totseats:** Total number of seats in the Chamber of Deputies

**Seats\_senate:** Absolute number of seats held by each party in the Senate (17<sup>th</sup> Legislature only).

**Totseats\_senate:** Total number of seats in the Senate (17<sup>th</sup> Legislature only).

**Speechtype:** 1 = Legislative speech of a single party. 2 = Missing legislative speeches have been estimated either by computing the average of the legislative speeches for that party during a given Legislature or by duplicating the previous or the following legislative speech data available. 3 = In case of a cabinet reshuffle in party composition, the party legislative speech data refers to the one of the previous government.

**Gov\_memb:** 1 = Parties in Cabinet. 0 = Parties not in Cabinet

**External\_sup:** 1 = Parties that casted a positive vote of confidence for the government (excluding parties in Cabinet. Cabinet parties always cast a positive vote of confidence). 0 = Parties that casted a negative vote of confidence or abstained

**Abstention:** 1 = Parties that abstained during the vote of confidence in the Chamber of Deputies. 0 = All other parties.

**Opposition:** 1 Parties that casted a negative vote of confidence for the government. 0 = All other parties.

## The categories employed

*Data Entries:* Percentages of sixty-eight categories grouped into eight major policy areas. Because of the different length of each speech, the number of quasi-sentences in each category is standardized taking the total number of quasi-sentences in the respective speech as a base. In the data set each of these categories is a variable that represents the percentage.

### *Policy Area 1: Foreign Policy*

#### **101 Foreign Special Relationships: Positive**

Favourable mentions of particular countries with which Italy has a special relationship. In particular: USA and Nato

#### **102 Foreign Special Relationships: Negative**

Negative mentions of particular countries with which Italy has a special relationship, In particular: USA and Nato ; otherwise as 101, but negative.

#### **103 Anti-Imperialism**

Negative references to exerting strong influence (political, military or commercial) over other states; negative references to controlling other countries as if they were part of an empire; favourable mentions of de-colonisation; favourable references to greater self-government and independence for colonies; negative references to the imperial behaviour of Italy and/or other countries.

#### **104 Military: Positive**

Need to maintain or increase military expenditure; modernising armed forces and improvement in military strength; rearmament and self-defence; need to keep military treaty obligations; need to secure adequate manpower in the military.

#### **105 Military: Negative**

Favourable mentions of decreasing military expenditures; disarmament; ‘evils of war’; promises to reduce conscription, otherwise as 104, but negative.

#### **106 Peace**

Peace as a general goal; declarations of belief in peace and peaceful means of solving crises; desirability of countries joining in negotiations with hostile countries.

***107 European Community: Positive***

Favourable mentions of European Community in general; desirability of expanding the European Community and/or of increasing its competence; desirability of Italy joining (or remaining a member).

***108 European Community: Negative***

Hostile mentions of the European Community; opposition to specific European policies which are preferred by European authorities; otherwise as 108, but negative.

***109 Urss: Positive***

Favourable mentions of particular countries. In particular: USSR and others socialist countries.

***110 Urss: Negative***

Negative mentions of particular countries. In particular: USSR and others socialist countries.

***111 Internationalism: Positive***

Need for international co-operation; co-operation with specific countries other than those coded in 101; need for aid to developing countries; need for world planning of resources; need for international courts; support for any international goal or world state; support for UN.

***112 Internationalism: Negative***

Favourable mentions of national independence and sovereignty as opposed to internationalism; otherwise as 111, but negative.

*Policy Area 2: Democracy*

***201 Parliament and Representative Institutions***

Support for the role of the parliament in the policy-making.

***202 Political Authority***

Favourable mentions of strong government, including government stability.

### **203 Democracy as a method of collective choice**

Favourable mentions of democracy as a method or goal in national and other organisations.

### **204 Democracy as a system of government**

Generalised support for country's democracy.

### **205 Fascism: Negative**

Hostile mentions to fascism and to inter-war Italian period.

### **206 Freedom and Human Rights**

Favourable mentions of importance of personal freedom; freedom of speech; freedom from coercion in the political sphere.

## *Policy Area 3: Centralization of decision making*

### **301 Decentralisation**

Support for federalism or devolution; more regional autonomy for policy or economy; support for keeping up local and regional customs and symbols; favourable mentions of special consideration for local areas; deference to local expertise.

### **302 Centralisation**

Opposition to political decision-making at lower political levels; support for more centralisation in political and administrative procedures; otherwise as 301, but negative.

## *Policy Area 4: Economic Policy*

### **401 Free Enterprise**

Favourable mentions of free enterprise capitalism; superiority of individual enterprise over state and control systems; favourable mentions of private property rights, personal enterprise and initiative; need for unhampered individual enterprises.

### **402 Incentives**

Need for wage and tax policies to induce enterprise; encouragement to start enterprises; need for financial and other incentives such as subsidies.

#### **403 Market Regulation**

Need for regulations designed to control private enterprises.

#### **404 Economic Planning**

Favourable mentions of long-standing economic planning of a consultative or indicative nature, need for government to create such a plan.

#### **405 Protectionism: Positive**

Favourable mentions of extension or maintenance of tariffs to protect internal markets; other domestic economic protectionism such as quota restrictions.

#### **406 Protectionism: Negative**

Support for the concept of free trade; otherwise as 405, but negative.

#### **407 Keynesian Demand Management**

Favourable mentions of demand-oriented economic policy; economic policy devoted to the reduction of depressions and/or to increase private demand through increasing public demand and/or through increasing social expenditures.

#### **408 Controlled Economy**

General need for direct government control of economy; control over prices, wages, rents, etc.; state intervention into the economic system.

#### **409 Nationalisation**

Favourable mentions of government ownership, partial or complete, including government ownership of land.

#### **410 Economic Orthodoxy**

Need for traditional economic orthodoxy, e.g. reduction of budget deficits, retrenchment in crisis, thrift and savings; support for traditional economic institutions such as stock market and banking system; support for strong currency.

#### **411 Marxist Analysis**

Positive references (typically but not necessary by communist parties) to the specific use of Marxist-Leninist terminology and analysis of situations which are otherwise uncodable.

#### ***412 Social Justice – fair distribution***

Concept of equality; special protection for underprivileged; need for fair distribution of resources; removal of class barriers

#### ***413 Welfare State Expansion***

Favourable mentions of need to introduce, maintain or expand any social service or social security scheme; support for social services such as health service or social housing. Note: This category excludes education.

#### ***414 Welfare State Limitation***

Limiting expenditure on social services or social security; otherwise as 413, but negative.

#### ***415 Labour Groups: Positive***

Favourable references to labour groups, working class, unemployed; support for trade unions; good treatment of manual and other employees.

#### ***416 Labour Groups: Negative***

Negative references to trade unions such as ‘abuse of power’; otherwise as 415, but negative.

#### ***417 Entrepreneur: Negative***

Negative references to business organizations and/or industrial associations.

#### ***418 Corporatism***

Favourable mentions of the need for the collaboration of employers and trade union organisations in overall economic planning and direction through the medium of tripartite bodies of government, employers, and trade unions.

#### ***419 Technology and Infrastructure***

Importance of modernisation of industry and methods of transport and communication; importance of science and technological developments in industry; need for training and research. This does not imply education in general (see category 421).

#### **420 Economic Goals**

Statements of intent to pursue any economic goals not covered by other categories in Domain 4.

This category is created to catch an overall interest of parties in economics and, therefore, covers a variety of economic goals.

#### **421 Education Expansion**

Need to expand and/or improve educational provision at all levels. This excludes technical training which is coded under 411.

#### **422 Education Limitation**

Limiting expenditure on education; otherwise as 421, but negative.

#### **423 Culture**

Need to provide cultural and leisure facilities including arts and sport; need to spend money on museums, art galleries etc.; need to encourage worthwhile leisure activities and cultural mass media.

#### **424 Agriculture and Farmers**

Support for agriculture and farmers; any policy aimed specifically at benefiting these.

#### **425 Middle Class and Professional Groups**

Favourable references to middle class, professional groups, such as physicians or lawyers; old and new middle class.

#### **426 Non-economic Demographic Groups**

Favourable mentions of, or need for, assistance to women, old people, young people, linguistic groups, etc; special interest groups of all kinds.

### *Policy Area 5: Environmental Policy*

#### **501 Environmental Protection**

Preservation of countryside, forests, etc.; general preservation of natural resources against selfish interests; proper use of national parks; soil banks, etc; environmental improvement.

#### **502 Anti-Growth Economy**

Favourable mentions of anti-growth politics and steady state economy; sustainable development.

### **503 Productivity**

Need to encourage or facilitate greater production; need to take measures to aid this; appeal for greater production and importance of productivity to the economy; the paradigm of growth.

## *Policy Area 6: Social Policy*

### **601 National Way of Life: Positive**

Appeals to patriotism and/or nationalism; support for established national ideas.

### **602 National Way of Life: Negative**

Against patriotism and/or nationalism; opposition to the existing national state; otherwise as 601, but negative.

### **603 Traditional Morality: Positive**

Favourable mentions of traditional moral values; prohibition, censorship and suppression of immorality and unseemly behaviour; maintenance and stability of family.

### **604 Traditional Morality: Negative**

Opposition to traditional moral values; support for divorce, abortion etc.; otherwise as 603, but negative.

### **605 Catholic Church: Positive**

Positive references to the Catholic Church.

### **606 Catholic Church: Negative**

As 605, but negative.

### **607 Multiculturalism: Positive**

Favourable mentions of cultural diversity, and to minorities such as homosexuals, immigrants. Negative mentions to sexist discrimination.

### **608 Multiculturalism: Negative**

As 607, but negative.

### **609 Law and Order: Positive**

Enforcement of all laws; actions against crime; support and resources for police; tougher attitudes in courts; suspension of some freedoms in order to protect the state against subversion.

### **610 Law and Order: Negative**

As 609, but negative.

### **611 Political Involvement**

Favourable mentions of democracy as involvement of citizens and movements in decision-making.

### **612 Social Harmony**

Appeal for national effort and solidarity; need for society to see itself as united; appeal for public spiritedness; decrying anti-social attitudes in times of crisis; support for the public interest.

## *Policy Area 7: Justice*

### **701 Independence**

Positive references to the need of promoting the judicial independence

### **702 Responsibility**

Support for the need of greater political control over the judiciary

## *Policy Area 8: Institutions*

### **801 Constitutionalism: Positive**

Support for specific aspects of the constitution; use of constitutionalism as an argument for policy as well as general approval of the constitutional way of doing things.

### **802 Constitutionalism: Negative**

Opposition to the constitution in general or to specific aspects; otherwise as 801, but negative.

### **803 Governmental and Administrative Efficiency**

Need for efficiency in government and administration; improving governmental procedures; general appeal to make the process of government and administration cheaper and more effective.

#### **804 Political Corruption**

Need to eliminate corruption, and associated abuse, in political and public life.

#### **805 Political Competence**

Party's competence to govern and/or other party's lack of such competence.

**Uncod:** Percentage of uncoded quasi-sentences.

**Total:** Total number of quasi-sentences.
